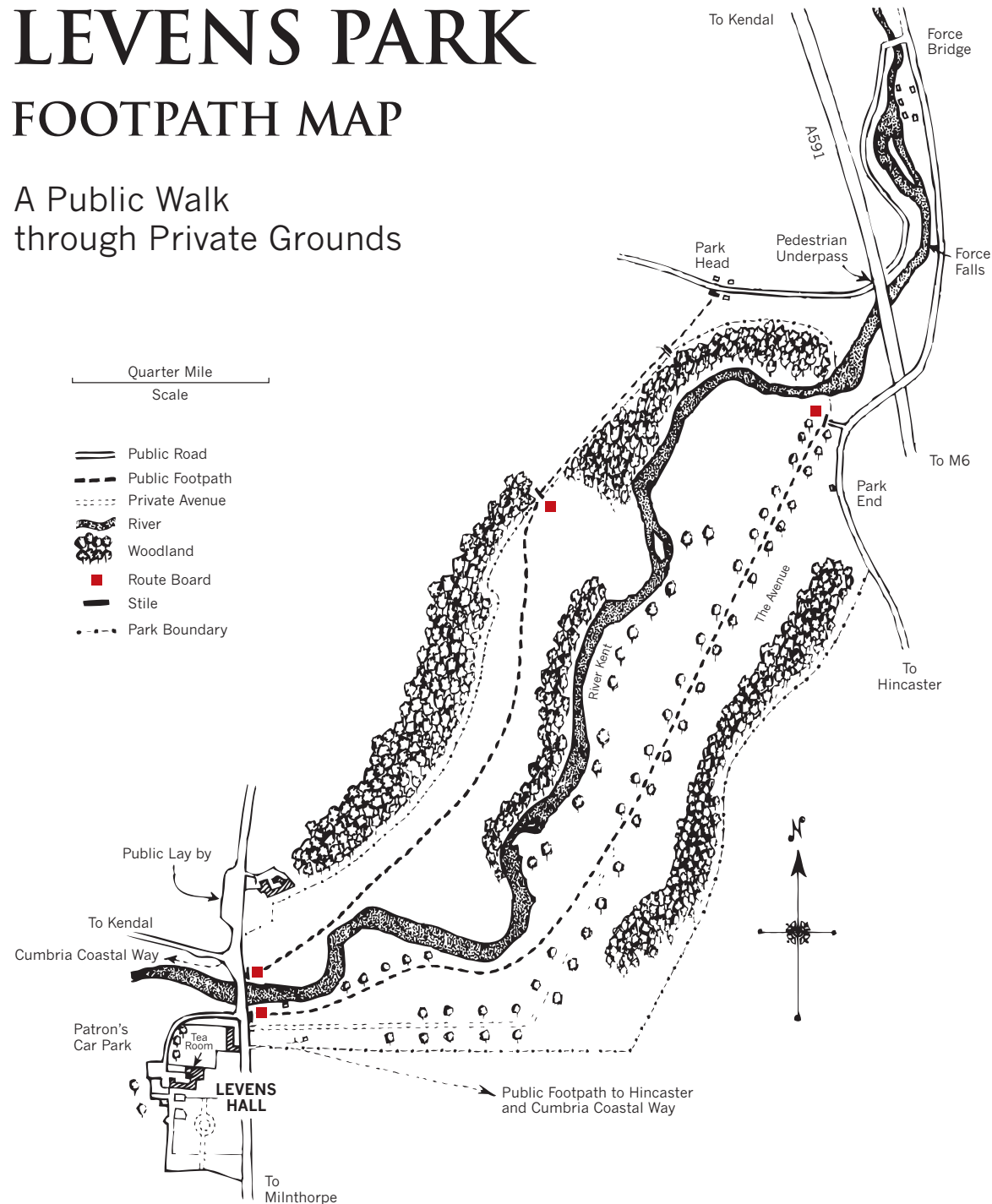


LEVENS PARK

through Private Grounds



WELCOME TO LEVENS PARK

Levens park forms part of the Levens Estate, through which runs the beautiful River Kent with historic Levens Hall situated nearby on its southern bank. The Park itself is private but visitors are welcome to walk through it using either of the two public footpaths linking the hall in the south-west with Park Head and the Sedgwick-Hincaster road.

Laid out between 1694 and 1710 by the celebrated French landscape designer Monsieur Guillaume Beaumont, who was also responsible for the world famous topiary gardens, many of the original trees remain as veterans in the mile-long avenue of oaks and the intermittent clumps of oak, beech and lime. Any losses are always replaced by new planting in the original positions. Levens Park is also home to an unusual herd of black fallow deer, a flock of sheep, a rare breed of distinctive black and white Bagot goats and many other species of woodland and riverside wildlife.

The Bagot family is happy to share the beauty of Levens Park with those who wish to experience its idyllic atmosphere and the the seasonal glories of its ancient trees. However, because the land adjacent to the public footpaths is reserved for the animals and they must on no account be disturbed, we would be grateful if our visitors would kindly observe the following requests:

- 1 Please keep to public footpaths as indicated on the map
- 2 Keep dogs on a lead AT ALL TIMES whilst in the Park
- 3 Please do not fish, bathe or throw objects in the river
- 4 Please do not light fires
- 5 Avoid standing near the trees during gales or thunderstorms
- 6 Always follow the Country Code and any advice given by the Park wardens
