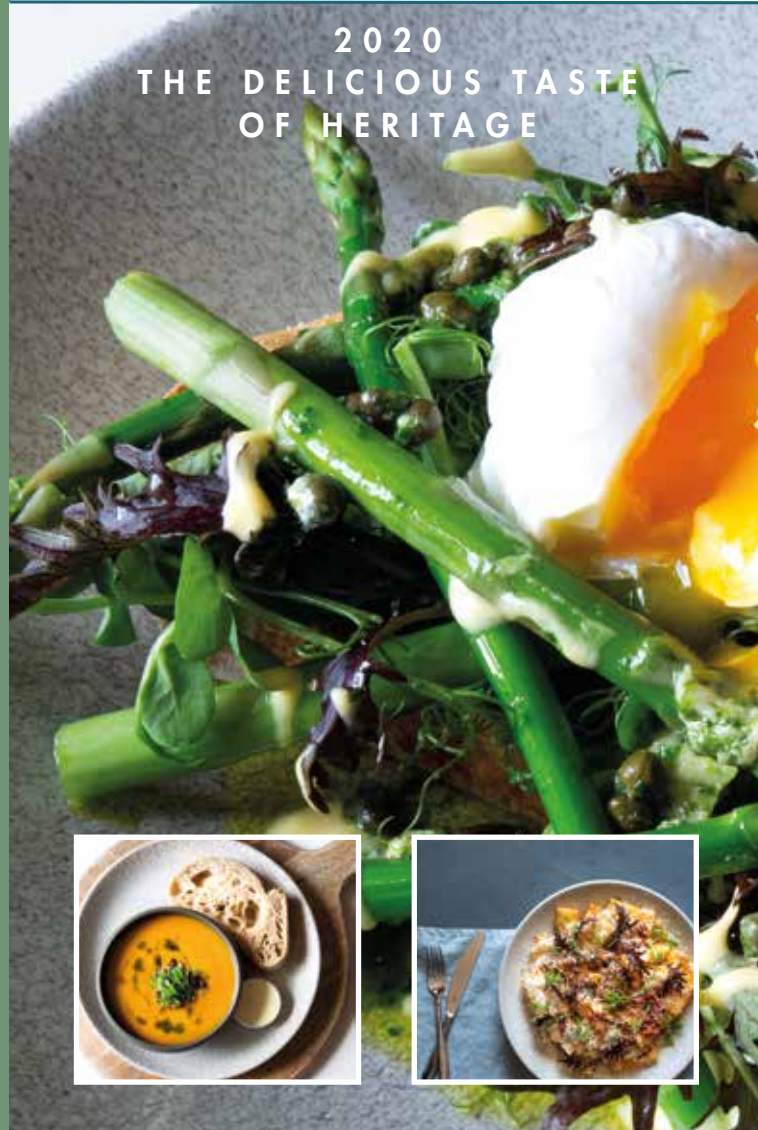
Levens Hall is situated on the Cumbria Coastal Way footpath and National Cycle Route 6 passes nearby.

Oxenholme Lake District mainline train station is a short taxi ride away.



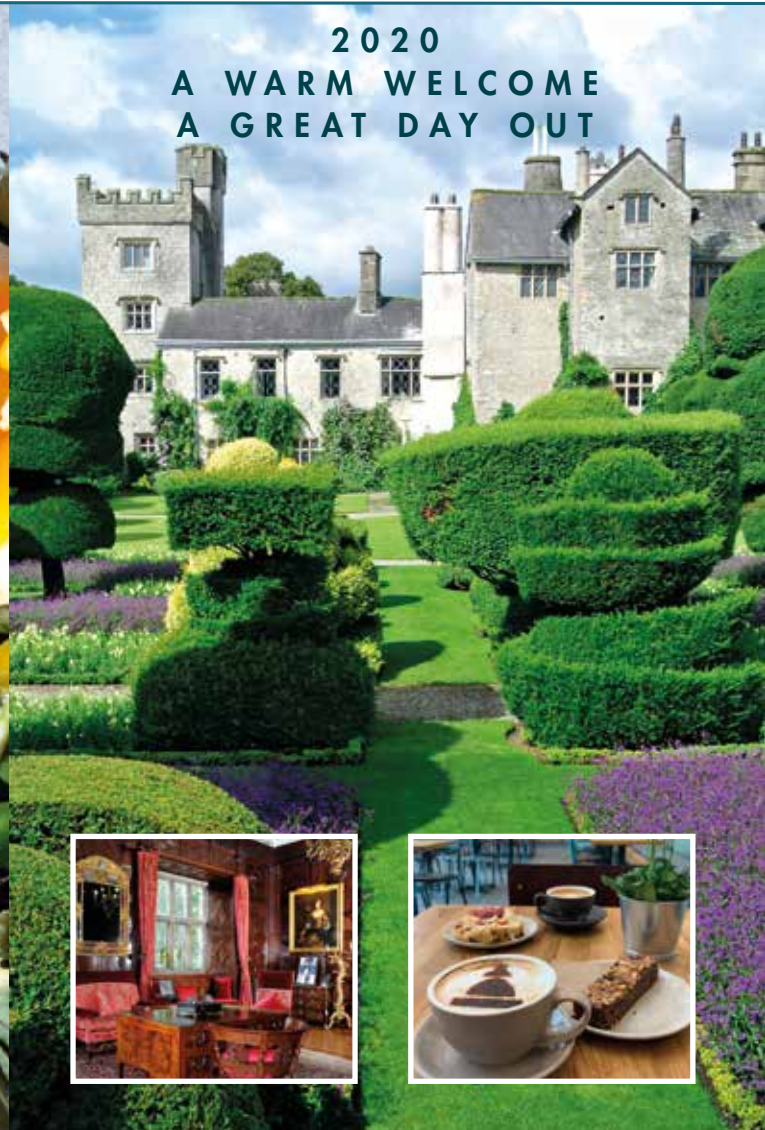

Once a stark, imposing Pele Tower built c1250-1300, Levens Hall has grown into an impressive Elizabethan house, with each generation leaving its mark on the architectural fabric of the building. The result is a stunning family home with spectacular interiors and impressive collections of furniture, clocks and paintings. The Hall has an intriguing history and fascinating links to the Duke of Wellington.

Designed in the 1690s by Monsieur Guillaume Beaumont, gardener to King James II and Colonel James Grahme, these ten acres of gardens retain many original features. With over 100 ancient box and yew trees sculpted into abstract or geometric shapes, the garden is a remarkable place to explore.

Levens Deer Park is situated just across the road from Levens Hall. If you have time to spare, take a stroll along the marked footpaths and discover some of the most beautiful and timeless scenery in the country – a haven for wildlife and a breath of peace and tranquillity in a busy world. Enjoy the stunning scenery and wildlife at any time of the year. The park is home to black fallow deer, kingfishers and a herd of rare breed Bagot goats.
